In my time here at the parish, Susan has been all about hospitality, getting people involved in the parish and recognizing volunteers. Thank you, Susan, for all of your years of dedication and service to the Church of St. Joseph.

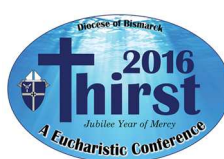
### Catholic Daughters of the Americas Monthly Meeting
